KANSAN'S FILM ON ARIKAREE BREAKS TO BE SHOWN AT HOLLENBERG PONY EXPRESS STATION STATE HISTORIC SITE

HANOVER, KS—The Kansas Historical Society announced the 2006 film *Kansas Canyon Lands* by Kansas native Audrey Kalivoda will be shown at 2 p.m. Saturday, October 4 at Hollenberg Pony Express Station State Historic Site. Kalivoda, who was raised in Brantford in southwest Washington County, will be at the event to talk about the film and answer questions. The event is free and includes the film and admission to the Pony Express Station visitor center and cabin. Refreshments will be served.

Kansas Canyon Lands captures the rugged beauty of the Arikaree (uh-RIK-uh-ree) Breaks, an expanse of canyons in northern Cheyenne County, formed when the area was an ocean bottom millions of years ago. The 20-minute film features the history of the canyons, including interviews with Tobe Zweygardt, a metal sculptor and historian who grew up near the Breaks and hiked, camped, and fished in the canyons.
