## GRAVESIDE CONVERSATIONS TELL THE STORY OF FORT HAYS

### *Cemetery Tours at Historic Fort Hays October 24*

**HAYS, Kan.**—The Kansas Historical Society announced that Fort Hays State Historic Site will host “Graveside Conversations” at Fort Hays Cemetery Saturday, October 24. Tours will be offered at 7:30, 8:30 and 9:30 p.m. There is no charge for the tour but reservations must be made by calling Fort Hays at 785-625-6812 or by e-mailing the fort at thefort@kshs.org.

Fort Hays was active from 1867 until 1889 and during those 22 years, at least 175 people were buried in the fort cemetery. Some of those deaths were the result of gunfights on the streets of Hays City and battles with American Indians. Far more, however, were the result of disease and accidents. Visitors will be able to hear how a few of these individuals lived and died from Fort Hays volunteers portraying “residents” of the cemetery. Among them are two soldiers who died in a shootout on the streets of Hays City, a young girl who died of typhoid fever, a mother looking for her daughter, and a soldier who died in combat with some American Indians north of Fort Hays.
