John Brown Museum Offers Special Tours for Railroad Day

OSAWATOMIE, KS—The Kansas Historical Society announced that the John Brown Museum State Historic Site will conduct special tours of the site 10 a.m. – 4 p.m. Saturday, April 21, during Railroad Day. The tour guide will be Mary Buster, great-great-granddaughter of Florella Brown Adair, the half-sister of John Brown. Buster's tours will include stories about John Brown and his family not found in history books.

John Brown Museum State Historic Site is located at 10th and Main Streets, Osawatomie. Admission fees are not charged, but a free will offering is suggested to assist with preservation of the historic site. For more information, call 913-755-4384.

About John Brown Museum: The site features an original log cabin that belonged to Brown's half sister and her husband, family furnishings and belongings, and Civil War weapons. The cabin served as John Brown's informal headquarters during the border war between Kansas and Missouri. The John Brown Museum State Historic Site is one of 16 state historic sites administered by the Kansas Historical Society, a state agency.
