

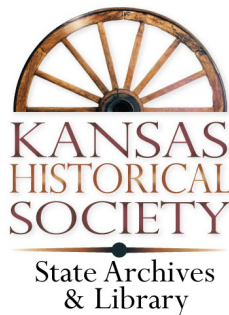

### ***Abstract***

The collection contains two large series of manuscript materials from Olive White Garvey and Ray Hugh Garvey, a married couple, living in Kansas, who were very successful entrepreneurs in the farming, grain storage, petroleum, building, and investment businesses, and who were very engaged in civic, social, political, educational, and philanthropic activities throughout their adult lives.

## **BIOGRAPHIES**

### ***Olive White Garvey***

Born in Arkansas City, Kansas on July 15, 1893, the fourth of five children of Oliver Holmes White and Caroline Hill White. Died in 1993 at the age of 99. Garvey was a business executive, educator, author, playwright, poet, civic leader, and philanthropist.

She attended public schools in Topeka, Kansas, and graduated from Washburn College with an A.B. degree in 1914. She taught high school English in Augusta, Kansas, for two years after her graduation before marrying Ray Hugh Garvey on July 8, 1916 and settling in Colby, Kansas. The couple had 4 children (Ruth Caroline, Willard White, James Sutherland, and Olivia Rae).

Garvey was Chairman and Director of Garvey, Inc., Garvey Center, Inc. and SRI, Inc.; President & Trustee of Garvey Foundation and Family Charities Foundation; and Trustee of 34 trusts. She was Director & Trustee of Friends University [Chairman 1974 & Honorary Chairman 1975-1984]; of the Herbert Hoover Presidential Library Association; Kansas 4-H Foundation; Music Theatre, Wichita Festival Committee; and Kansas Coliseum Board. She was a member of the National Board of Governors of the Institute of Logopedics; International Institute of Education; Republican Women; and the Wichita Metropolitan Council.

She received awards from Phi Kappa Phi; Nonoso; Woman of the Year Award; and the Delta Gamma Cable Award. She was awarded an honorary doctorate in Public Services from Friends University, honorary doctorate of Letters from Oklahoma Christian College, and honorary doctorates from both Washburn University and Wilson College. She received the Salesman of the Year Award; Brotherhood Award NCCJ; Martin Palmer Humanitarian Award; Distinguished Service Award in Agriculture from Kansas State University; "Over the Years" Award and Uncommon Citizen Award of Wichita; and the Rose Award of Delta Gamma.

She received a Medal of Honor from the Daughters of the American Revolution; a Distinguished Service Citation from the University of Kansas; Kansan of the Year for 1984; cited for Outstanding Service to 4-H for 1967; Patron of Kansas Press Women; Honorary Member of Glovia; and was named to the 4-H Hall of Fame in 1977. She was named to the Honor Roll of the American Society of Colonial Dames, and was included in Wichita State University's Business Heritage Series of 1985 in a book by Dr. Billy Jones ("Olive W. Garvey: Humanitarian, Corporate Executive, Uncommon Citizen").

Garvey was a sponsor of the Hoover Presidential Library Association's Essay Contest, the Mont Pelerin Society Annual Fellowships for prize-winning essays, and The Center for the Improvement of Human Functioning. She was affiliated with the National League of American Pen Women (serving as State

President in 1952); the Kansas Authors' Club (District President); P.E.O.; Delta Gamma Fraternity; National Society of Colonial Dames of America (State President in 1964); the Twentieth Century Club; Jamestown Society; Wichita Art Association; American Association of University Women; Phi Kappa Phi; D.A.R.; and the Plymouth Congregational Church.

She was included in Who's Who of the Midwest; Who's Who of American Women; 2,000 Women of Achievement; The Writer's Directory; Dictionary of International Biography; International Who's Who in Community Service; International Who's Who of Professional and Business Women; International Directory of Distinguished Leadership; Directory of Distinguished Americans; 2,000 Notable Americans; Who's Who in Kansas; Who's Who in the USA; North American Edition of Women in Business; World's Who's Who of Women; Who's Who in Finance & Industry; Community Leaders of America; and The Registry of American Achievement.

## ***Ray Hugh Garvey***

### THESE ARE ROUGH NOTES FOR RHG'S BIOGRAPHY

Born January 3, 1893 on a farm in Phillips County, Kansas, the youngest of three children of Seth Homer Garvey and Nettie Post Garvey (nee Jannetta Jane Post). Died June 30, 1959 at the age of 66 of injuries sustained in an automobile accident on a highway near McPherson, Kansas.

Graduated from high school in Phillipsburg, Kansas. Taught school for one year before entering Washburn College in the fall of 1910. Received an A.B. degree in 1914, and an L.L.B. degree from Washburn College in 1915.

Upon graduation, he practiced law and served as County Attorney for Thomas County from his offices in Colby, Kansas. He married Olive Hill White of Augusta, Kansas on July 8, 1916, and the couple settled in Colby, Kansas. They had 4 children (Ruth Caroline, Willard White, James Sutherland, and Olivia Rae).

"Farming operations in Colby from 1916 to 1928 were followed by far-flung entrepreneurial business operations in farming, grain, elevators, petroleum, construction, and investment corporations."

He was the first farmer in the country? world? to produce a one million bushel wheat crop (1947), and built the world's largest grain elevator in Wichita.

Ray Garvey earned money for college by planting wheat each winter on a rented quarter of land. He bought and ran two paper routes while attending college at Washburn University in Topeka. He left Topeka in 1914 with an AB degree and in 1915 with an LL.B. degree. His life was fueled by an energetic outlook and a natural curiosity.

Became a partner in Judge A.A. Kendall's land business in 1918. In order to sell the land and to run it effectively, Garvey went to work himself. He innovated by running large acreages like a business, and asking the farmers to account for every penny of expense. Eventually his farms operated over 100,000

acres, and on them, Garvey harvested a 1,000,000 bushel wheat crop in 1947 - the largest harvest for an individual known in American history.

Garvey was known by those who knew him as "a Good Story." He dressed down and drove a Ford to avoid "putting on airs" as well as to show his employees an example of a low cost operation. He was known as a strict but ethical negotiator who always followed through on his deals.

Aside from farming, Garvey went into the businesses of fuel, low-costing housing, and grain elevators. He also created Amortibanc, to deal with installment securities, and Petroleum, Inc., to deal with the need to invest income from the farming operation.

During the 1930s, Garvey concentrated on real estate acquisition in western Kansas and formed several farming partnership companies. Much of this land was farmed by tenant farmers who paid rent to Garvey. He also owned the Service Oil Company that had several service stations and distribution centers in Western Kansas. Toward the end of the decade, he purchased a number of defunct banks and acquired their remaining assets including real estate and mortgage notes. During World War II, Ray Garvey formed Builders, Inc., and became involved in housing construction and rentals in the Wichita area. After the war, his sons Willard and James became managers of several of his companies. James Garvey took responsibility for the farming operations and Willard Garvey assumed control of Builders, Inc.

Ray Garvey continued investing in real estate, this time focusing on eastern Colorado land. In partnerships with John Kriss and H.C. Wear, he acquired vast expanses of virgin ranch and farm land. Garvey expanded into oil exploration and distribution with the formation of Petroleum, Inc. and Drillers, Inc. during the latter half of the 1940s. As the 1950s began, Ray Garvey embarked on his involvement with grain elevator terminals. During the last ten years of his life, Garvey erected elevators in Kansas, Nebraska, and Texas, including the largest single grain elevator in the world located in Wichita, Kansas. The C-G-F Grain Company also had the largest amount of agricultural storage space in the world, and it was in this industry that Ray Garvey received his greatest publicity. Much attention was focused on the amount of money he received in the form of government subsidies by several major newspapers and national magazines.

Throughout his career, Ray Garvey was involved in political and national issues. He philosophically and financially supported several political organizations including the Republican party and the America First Committee. He exchanged correspondence with many Governors, members of Congress, Presidents, and other government officials on a regular basis regarding his political concerns about the United States economy, foreign policy, government spending, and taxes. Additionally, Garvey was involved with many civic and academic organizations and contributed frequently to them through the Garvey Foundation.

## SCOPE AND CONTENTS OF THE PAPERS

The collection is composed of personal and business manuscript materials created by or for Olive White Garvey and Ray Hugh Garvey.

## ARRANGEMENT OF THE PAPERS

The collection (MC 809) is organized into two series:

SERIES 1: OLIVE WHITE GARVEY PAPERS – Contains 84 boxes of photographs and manuscript materials, organized in 7 subseries, about Olive White Garvey and her business, civic, family, philanthropic, and travel activities.

SERIES 2: RAY HUGH GARVEY PAPERS – Contains 41 boxes of manuscript materials, organized in a single series, about Ray Hugh Garvey and his business activities.

30 boxes of the Olive White Garvey Papers (series 1, subseries 5-7), and 4 boxes of the Ray Hugh Garvey Papers (series 2), were processed in August and October, 2007, by Kathleen Rogge (Lela Barnes Archival Intern, Kansas Historical Society).

37 boxes of the Ray Hugh Garvey Papers (series 2) were processed in May, 1999, by Anthony Brusca (Special Collections, Wichita State University) with funding provided by a Garvey Family grant.

Rogge created this finding aid that provides detailed information about the collections and combines all three processors' container descriptions for the Olive White Garvey and Ray Hugh Garvey Papers collection (ms. 809).

When file folders are titled with the original description found in Ray Garvey's personal files, that title is underlined. Each year's correspondence is subdivided alphabetically into files, with each file's documents being arranged in reverse chronological order. Oversized documents were removed from these files and are stored in Box 37. Every attempt was made to maintain Ray Garvey's filing system in its original form.  This collection of Ray Hugh Garvey's papers begins with a 1922 land sales journal and extends to 1959 (materials from years 1938, 1946, and 1948-1950 are missing). They include correspondence, business documents, personal papers, newspaper articles, maps, blueprints, and photographs. This collection documents Garvey's career and the growth of his empire in regard to real estate, agriculture, livestock, the oil industry, construction, banking, and grain elevator terminals.  The Ray Hugh Garvey Papers also contain correspondence between Garvey and his friends, members of his family, and other business leaders that express his views on a wide variety of topics and reflect his personal character and demeanor. Throughout his life, he corresponded regularly with several close friends and business associates including W.D. Ferguson, John Kriss, and H.C. Wear.
