Both buildings are similiar Mission style designs. The depot, which is east of the former hotel, is distinguished by a central two-story cross-gable section between two one-story wings. The two-story hotel has a rectangular plan. Both buildings have concrete foundations, brick walls to the midline of the first story and stuccoed frame walls above to the eave. Gable ends terminate in a curvilinear parapet with stepped edges. The eaves are extended on exposed rafters and the gable roofs are covered with

red clay tiles. All exterior woodwork is painted white. The most prominent feature is a one-story frame verandah on the east, south, and west sides of the hotel building.

Both buildings have suffered from a lack of maintenance. The depot is particularly deteriorated and vacant. The first floor of the hotel building is used for railroad offices.
