Packing the Trunk:

Bottom Layer

A packing diagram is included in the trunk for use in repacking it. The trunk must be packed carefully to enable the lid to close easily and tightly. The packing bags should be used to provide padding for the models.

Top Layer

Bags containing the exhibit boards and the photos/books and manual are positioned across the layer of models. The game cloth is placed on top of these bags.
