Description: The Old First National Bank is a rectangular two-story brick commercial
building with a diagonal corner projection. As originally constructed in 1889 it had
an elaborate Second Empire style mansard roof with ornamental chimneys, round-arched
dormers, and iron cresting. The corner projection was originally round. By 1899 the
mansard roof had been removed. In 1907 the building was substantially altered. The
corner projection was rebuilt, and the cornice and beltcourse were redone to match those
of the newly-constructed opera house next door. In later years the windows on the first
floor were filled with glass block, the original north doorway was filled in, and the
1907 door on the corner was replaced. The pressed metal ceiling remains, but has been
hidden behind a dropped ceiling. The original bank vault remains and is in excellent condition, but the other interior furnishings of the bank have been removed. The second story has retained much of its original interior appearance.

Significance The old First National Bank building is notable as one of the two oldest
emaining commercial buildings in Dighton, and one of the few remaining from the
nineteenth century. It has important historical associations with the commercial
development of Dighton from its construction until the bank moved to a new building in
950.
