Description: The Evangelical Covenant Mission Church is a rectangular frame structure with gable roof, gabled vestibule and prominent square entrance tower. This feature is Collegiate Gothic in detailing. A basement was added in 1951, new doors have been added to the entrances, storm windows installed, concrete steps provided, an asphalt shingle roof has been applied and the facade wall extended, causing the addition of a second sloping roof denoting a vestibule feature of some sort. Evidently, insulation has been blown into the walls as the exterior
Significance:

This church is associated with the early Swedish community of Osage City. Its present appearance, with its prominent Collegiate gothic tower, reflects architectural tastes of the late 19th century.
